



## Multicultural Mural Community Project Information Sheet for Participants

### Summary of the project:

The Multicultural Mural Community Project aims to establish a mural which represents Surrey's cultural, ethnic, linguistic and religious diversity through the collaboration of community members from diverse backgrounds or perspectives, including youth, seniors, new immigrants and refugees. The project participants will develop the mural design to reflect their views of a welcoming and inclusive community through focus group sessions and a workshop. They will increase their awareness for and understanding of social, cultural, ethnic, linguistic and religious diversity among BC. The mural will be placed on a wall site in Newton which has been identified by the community and City as an area that needs improvement as it is attracting unwanted activity. The City of Surrey will make a set of 3 street banners from the mural design and it will be placed throughout the Newton town center.

- A 2 hour Focus Group Session in December/2011
- An hour Finalizing Mural Design Workshop in February/2011
- A Promotional Event and Evaluation in May/2012
